- The SPS Board of Education voted to place a \$189 million bond issue on the April 4 ballot.

# **Parliamentary Tip of the Month**

Know your term limits; consult your bylaws. Most PTAs only allow officers to hold the same position for 2, one-year terms. Many PTAs' bylaws stipulate that any person who has served in an office for more than one half of a full term shall be deemed to have served a full term in such office.



# **Legislative Call to Action**

# Please contact your Senators now!

SB 32 has been placed on the Senate calendar.

SB 32 would establish the Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program.

The Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program is a concern for PTA because this program would create an account that would allow taxpayers to make a qualifying contribution to an educational assistance organization and claim a tax credit, as described in the act. The tax credit is for one hundred percent of the amount of the contribution. The tax credit may be carried forward for four years and may be transferred, sold, or assigned. The scholarships will be used in private schools effectively creating a voucher system in Missouri.

Missouri PTA encourages you to send emails to your Senators but also to directly call their office and ask them to vote no on SB 32.
