Treasurer's Tips and Report

- Make sure you are keeping your financial records up to date. You should never be more
 than 30 days without new financials (ie review November activity at December or possibly
 January based on when you hold your board meetings each month).
- Financials should be distributed to the board of directors each month and you should make financial information available to members.
- Each bank statement and the related check images should be reviewed by someone who isn't authorized to sign checks to ensure checks are being written for valid expenses of the unit. The person reviewing the documents should sign the statement to document this process. This is a "best practice" but is also required for certain insurance policies.
- Whenever you are collecting or counting money, you should have two members present.
 Daily deposits are highly recommended but if that is not possible, funds should be locked in a safe place until they are taken to the bank.
- Following best practices on cash handling protects the unit as well as the volunteers. If you have any questions or concerns about your financial reporting, don't hesitate to contact me at treasurer@scptamo.com.
