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A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

This will be our last SCPTA newsletter for this school year. It has been a busy one for sure. We have visited seven of our elementary schools who hosted our monthly meetings. Our buildings are unique and diverse and it's nice to see the options our school district offers. The entertainment by the children is always wonderful and inspiring!

As you finish up your unit meetings and PTA/PTSA business in May, here is a quick guide to help you cover critical areas. Your efforts to complete this list will ensure your unit will have a smooth start next year. The hardest thing for a new officer to overcome is not having the tools to help them do what they agreed to. Remember, PTA materials belong to the PTA, not to the person.

- Current officers and committee chairs should complete their year-end reports, collect their materials and procedure books, and pass them on to their successors. Make sure all passwords and account information changes hands as well.
- Signatures on the PTA bank account(s) should be changed to the new treasurer, secretary, and president if needed. (Remember that all checks should be signed by two people.)
- > Your new officers should be installed and outgoing or retiring leaders should be thanked for their service.
- New committee chairs should meet with their predecessors, and review materials that have been passed on in their procedure books.
- > Committee chairs should recruit members and prepare plans of work for approval by the PTA board.
- > Your treasurer, other officers, and appropriate committee chairs should prepare the proposed budget for the coming year. Your PTA budget should reflect

your goals.

- Your treasurer should pay all bills, settle all accounts, and be sure records are ready for the financial review.
- A financial review committee should be appointed and prepare to review the treasurer's books in a timely manner.
- Your new PTA Board should meet and set some PTA goals for the coming year. Plan the calendar for the coming year for membership meetings, board meetings, special events and meet with the principal on all building requests.
- Personally introduce your new officers to Principals, teachers, community leaders and other PTA contributors.
- If your PTA bylaws were reviewed or amended make sure to send two copies to the Missouri PTA State office. (Your bylaws can be emailed to office1@mopta.org.)
- Be sure you have sent the names and addresses to MOPTA for all officers for next year. This needs to be done even if your officers are staying in their positions. ALSO, send a list of your new officers with name, email and phone to <u>council@scptamo.com</u>
- All unit leaders should attend the SCPTA School of Information in May and the Officer Orientation in August.

In summary, PTA Leaders please take the time to reflect and review your past year accomplishments and express your appreciation to all your volunteers. Remember to register your kiddos for EXPLORE so they can attend as your family schedule allows. Here's to an exciting and safe summer!

HISTORIAN'S REPORT 2017-2018

President - Becky Volz

My first year as Council president started on **May** 26th, **June** 16th and July 21st with our first Board Retreat meetings and a google hangout meeting. We reviewed our bylaws and standing rules, set some goals and dates for the upcoming school year's meetings. **August** 8th was our Officer Orientation held at the KAC with 50+ attending. I prepared the printed packets and Christie Browne created the power point presentation. I presented the SCPTA annual report to the School Board at a September meeting. I worked with the Springfield Mayor's office to create a Proclamation for Principals for National Principals Month in October. I initiated a feature story about the Clothing Bank in the SGF Neighborhood News and I initiated the printing of directional/yard signs to support our monthly council meetings. I Chair the School Crossing Protection Committee for Traffic Operations' quarterly meetings. I also chaired the scholarship committee and the Founders Day committee. I purchased the VOY gifts and created their certificates. All throughout the year I have had the pleasure of one-on-one meetings with a number of PTA / PTSA officers providing individual training and support; as well as helping several with 990s and financial reports including helping four units reinstate.

I attended the following events or meetings representing SCPTA: the Annual meeting and donor recognition reception for Don't Meth With Us; Foundation for SPS Board meetings and strategic planning meeting and sat on the Teacher of the Year committee and attended the annual Teacher Appreciation Banquet; the Prosper Springfield Advisory Council Education Committee quarterly meetings; the Reflections Showcase at the Battlefield Mall; the Town Hall meeting at York Elementary regarding school closings with Q&A led by Dr Jungmann; participated in the Parent Focus group for Mental Health Needs Assessment for Springfield-Greene County Health Dept at KAC; attend MOPTA state convention in 2017 and 2018; met with students presenting the YEP grant to the Clothing Bank. I volunteered a few times at the clothing bank as well as collected and delivered donations throughout the year.

At each of our meetings listed below, principals and unit presidents gave greetings and children gave musical performances and led the pledge of allegiance.

September we met at Study Alternative Center. We had a presentation from Study teacher Anna Phillips about the school garden and impact on students. New Council officers & chairs were introduced. Past President Carrie Windes was presented with Lifetime Achievement Award from National PTA and the MOPTA Distinguished Service Award. Superintendent Dr John Jungmann gave his summer school and Club Encore report, reviewed survey results for failed bond issue and recognized this is the 150th year for SPS.

October we met at Jeffries Elementary. We recognized all Principals with a framed Proclamation signed by Mayor McClure to celebration National Principals Month. Mayor pro tem Jan Fisk presented the awards. Dr Jungmann presented his update highlighting the Alumni Hall of Fame inductees. Rebecca Hughes was presented as treasurer nominee and was approved by vote. Battlefield Mall is requiring a \$250 fee for Reflections Showcase this year. A motion was made and approved to pay the fee.

November we met at Bowerman Elementary. Dr Mike Dawson presented the Superintendent's report with an update on the Master Facility Plan next steps. Budget increases were presented and approved to add insurance coverage to our policy. Donna Petiford introduced our Town Hall elected officials participating in the panel. The panel discussion was moderated by MOPTA president Dorothy Gardner.

December we met at Sherwood Elementary. Dr Jungmann gave the Superintendent's report then introduced Dr Shane Dublin, Executive Director of Secondary Education to explain the new Freshman Academy model and process for Hillcrest and Glendale coming next year. SCPTA nomination committee nominees were presented and approved. MOSSA (Missouri School Safety Association) president Zac Rantz gave a presentation for MOSSA. Special guest Jeree Michelle Thomas, Policy Director with Campaign for Youth Justice from Washington DC presented information on upcoming state legislative bill in MO "18 in 18" to "Raise the Age" in Missouri for youth in the adult prison system. Membership awards/certificates were presented to Jeffreis, Kickapoo, Central, Cherokee, Bissett, Mann, Sequiota, Sunshine Disney, Gray, Wilsons Creek & York.

January no meeting was held in January, but a Council newsletter was prepared and emailed to all Council presidents and principals.

February we met at Rountree Elementary. Rountree's intern from France, Maaria Riaz, gave a description of her work at Rountree. Deputy Superintendent Carol Embree gave the report and Facility Master plan update which, at this time, includes the closing of Campbell Elementary and merging with McGregor Elementary and opening Campbell as an Early Childhood Education campus. Mandy Buettgen, Traffic Operations, gave a presentation of SGF

Yields campaign for pedestrian safety. Jamie Deckard & Kathy Moore from OACAC gave a presentation on their programs for schools called VOICE and REALL. Laura Erwin gave reminder of the RIP program and upcoming fundraisers and offered two giveaways. Awards/Certificates were presented to Principals who applied for the CARE & McBride Funds.

March we met at Portland Elementary. Crystal Scott, President of Disney PTA presented on having a successful PTA unit. Tori Sallee, Ozark Regional Director for MOPTA, spoke on benefits of attending State and National conventions. Andrea Battaglia, MOPTA Contact Editor, addressed Child Advocacy and how we can watch alerts from MOPTA and Jeff City and encouraged units to submit their stories to Contact newsletter. Julia Stalder, Chair of the Nominations Committee, presented the slate of officers for next year. All presented were approved.

April we met at Sunshine Elementary. Dr Mike Dawson gave Superintendent's report and update on Master Facility Plan. BOE voted in new officers: Jill Patterson as President and Tim Rosenbury as Vice President. SPS Counseling Services coordinator, Alison Roffers, presented the diversity of the school counselors. Counselors from each school level were present for Q&A: Rick Greiner (Sunshine), Jill Wilson (Cherokee) and Coyeatte Ewing (Glendale). Dana Hubbard, Director of Summer Learning and Student Experiences presented on plans for Explore this summer with Q&A. A SCPTA bylaws change in the language for Article XVII was presented and approved. Jennifer Penny was nominated as VP of Org & Dev. A vote was taken and approved.

May meeting will be held at the Discovery Center and is co-hosted by SCPTA and the Discovery Center. Major Saver Fundraiser checks will be presented to schools, units and the clothing bank, as well as 100% meeting attendance checks to units. The 2018-2019 Budget will be presented for approval. We will have the installation of the officers for next year. School of Information will be on May 3rd at Central High School. The last executive board meeting for SCPTA will be on May 16th at KAC.

Legislative Chair - Donna Petiford

In November Council presented a Legislative Rally/Town Hall Meeting as part of our regular Council Meeting. Six elected officials attended with 65 PTA leaders and school administrators in attendance. Dorothy Gardner, Missouri PTA President, served a moderator.

Council did not host a school board candidates' forum this year because there were no school board members with expiring terms.

By hosting our legislative event, encouraging members to actively participate in legislative endeavors, and promoting PTA issues at the state and national level, our council was awarded the Missouri PTA Advocacy through Legislation Outstanding Council Award.

Vice President Organization & Development - Julia Spiva

Handbook Continuing the change made last year, the handbook is posted in an electronic format on the SCPTA website. A printed handbook was provided to all attendees at the Officer Orientation training in August.

Bylaws: SCPTA bylaws were amended and approved by Council September 6, 2017 and approved by MOPTA December 6, 2017. Our bylaws will be up for review again in 2020. SCPTA Standing Rules were amended and approved on September 6, 2017. All schools that had bylaw revisions coming up were notified and offered assistance as needed. State office information on bylaw renewals was reviewed, and those schools that did not have their bylaws renewed were contacted to let them know that they were not in good standing. We have 36 units in good standing.

Scholarships: SCPTA offers 5 scholarships each year to a graduating senior from each high school. Each scholarship awards \$500 and is named for distinguished past PTA volunteers/educators: Joan Keiser Scholarship, Helen Smith Scholarship, and Grace Carr Scholarship as well as the PTA 2-year and 4-year scholarships. This year's recipients are: Hillcrest, Emma King, Helen Smith Scholarship; Central, Lorena Cardenas, SCPTA 2-year; Glendale, Maddie Duncan, SCPTA 4-year; Kickapoo, Mason Sellman, Grace Carr; and Parkview, pending, Joan Keiser.

Gertrude McBride Fund: Eleven high school and middle schools received McBride checks totaling \$2200. Spring-field Council of PTAs awarded high schools and middle schools each from the Gertrude McBride Fund. This fund was established in 1921 to honor Gertrude McBride, an educator, school board President, and a founding member of our local PTA. These fund are designated to provide assistance to students in need. Central HS Glendale HS Hill-crest HS Kickapoo HS Carver MS, Cherokee MS, Hickory Hills MS, Jarrett MS, Pershing MS, Pleasant View MS and Reed Academy.



CARE Fund: Twenty-three schools received CARE fund checks for a total of \$2300. Elementary schools were awarded, each to recognize outstanding student behavior, attendance, and academic achievement. This fund was established in 2004 to honor Charlie Nickel, a longtime Springfield educator and PTA supporter. Bingham, Bissett, Boyd, Cowden, Delaware, Disney, Gray, Harrison, Hickory Hills, Jeffries, McCann, McBride, Pershing, Pleasant View, Robberson, Sequiota, Sherwood, Sunshine, Truman, Watkins, Wilder, Wilson's Creek and York.

Resource Development: Seventeen schools participated in the Major Saver discount card fundraiser and combined they raised more than \$43,150! The 17 schools' PTA Units will receive \$200 from SCPTA each as incentive for participating in the fundraiser and the school that sold the most cards will receive a \$500 check for their school site. In addition to the money raised from card sales, Major Saver is donating \$200 to the Clothing Bank for every school that participated: Bissett E, Disney E, Harrison E, Mann E, Jeffries E, Twain, E, Pershing E, Pittman E, Pleasant View E, Portland E, Watkins E, Wilson's Creek 5-6, and York E, Jarrett M, Pershing M, Pleasant View M, and Cherokee M.

Promotions

Membership Report: Total Council memberships for 2017-2018 are 3,970 individuals and 179 businesses. Total: 4,149 Five units were given cash awards for the highest increase in memberships by November 30th.

11 units increased their membership from January to March with Greenwood being #1 with 45 new members in 2018. Thank you for being a member! (PS: Just eight years ago our Council had 12,000 members. We can do it again. Remember to ask.)

Founders Day Banquet was held this year at Parkview High School. The theme was "Servant Leadership" high-lighting the Leadership School that is housed at Parkview. We chose PHS senior Anthony Saviello to be our Master of Ceremony. Entertainment was provided by PHS thespian with a couple of songs from their show Pippin which included a freshman vocalist Clayton Cox serenading Dr Jungmann. PHS choir also performed two selections. Jennifer Penny was awarded the Missouri PTA Distinguished Service Award. We celebrated with 10 SCPTA past presidents who were in attendance: Joan Keiser, Colleen Copeland, June Jansen, Ida Berry, Debbie Hickey, Peggy Stepp, Donna Petiford, Mary Christiano, Patty Dunn, Carrie Windes. We recognized and gave a gift to 41 Volunteers of the Year.

Hospitality – Heather Buckner

The SCPTA purchased 2 cases of Apples from Kiwanis in the fall to show appreciation to the KAC Administrative staff and Bentley building staff. Coordinated and assisted PTA/PTSA presidents of the schools hosting general SCPTA monthly meetings. Helped with food selection and setup for the Founder's Day Banquet at Parkview High School. Will provide refreshments for our May SCPTA meeting. Will provide food/drinks/door prizes for the School of Information Training on May 3rd at Central High School.

Vice President Health & Public Services – Allison Lawson Clothing Bank Chairs – Patty Dunn & Jennifer Penny

The PTA Clothing Bank provided free clothing to SPS students during 2,152 shopping visits during the 2017-2018 school year, with numbers reported from August 1, 2017 through April 26, 2018. Item counts from additional shopping during Explore Summer Session in June will be reported in the fall. The SCPTA board continued the (now) tradition of holding the first General Council Meeting at Study Alternative Center which brought our PTA leaders into the Clothing Bank as a great start to the year. The SPS School Nurses also held one of their meetings at Study Alternative Center, and Jennifer Penny and Patty Dunn hosted the nurses for a tour of the Clothing Bank. The PTA Clothing Bank was also shown in two television news stories: the first focused on Kathryn Wilkerson and her extraordinary weekly donations of new clothing, and the second focused on the assistance that the PTA Clothing Bank, SPS district and other community organizations were able to provide following a building fire that left many SPS students homeless. We also sought to increase our social media following and presence this year with the goal of also increasing the number of students served, the participation of donors and volunteers, and the information available to our PTA units. The PTA Clothing Bank was on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. The PTA Clothing Bank also was able to secure a donation of 2,000 pairs of socks from Bombas.com, and this grant reviewed social media accounts and number of followers in the approval process. The efforts of all resulted in a bounty of donations, several new volunteers and many SPS students ready for school with clothing, shoes, socks and underwear.



Safety Chair - Mary Christiano

School Crossing Protection Committee Chairperson met three times. Becky Volz, SCPTA President, acted as committee chair and conducted quarterly meetings. For the 2017-2018 school year, Springfield Council of PTAs were represented at meetings also by Allison Lawson, Mary Christiano, and Sarah Whitten, Horace Mann PTA. The School Crossing Protection Committee continues to actively seek a parent representative from each of the five high school areas to attend quarterly meetings on behalf of SCPTA and the schools in their high school area.

Vice President Programs – Laura Erwin 4th Grade Play Chair – Flo Graham

Over 2000 fourth graders from our 36 elementary schools had the opportunity to attend "Elf Jr. The Musical". All of the 4th grade students in the district were provided transportation to the Springfield Little Theatre for four performances held on December 5 and 6. As always, it was a wonderful opportunity for all of our 4th graders. Thank you to PTA Council, SPS transportation, and Marty Moore for continuing to make this wonderful event happen.

Reading is Fundamental (RIF) Chair - Peggy Stepp

Reading Is Fundamental had a successful year. It started with training of coordinators in September and the three distributions to all the first and second grade students. This year's theme was "Investigate Reading – How do things work?".
