Very supportive parents, theme Kindness counts, Biggest event is "Write a check" fundraiser in September for teacher grants, Goal, to get dollars into classrooms. Be aware of a community task force for facilities that includes parents, kids, teachers and other community leaders from the entire footprint of all feeder patterns are represented. They started in June analyzing facility master plan to set up recommendations for our future bond issue. Board will hear from them in October. Focusing on the most important project. Becky Volz Recognized the SPS administration and Introduced Dr. Brett Range and his team Director Jim Ferrell of School Police

Dr. Brett Range presented along side of Dr. Travis Shaw/Executive Director of Operations talked about safety...Thanks to Parents for supporting our Schools. Parents will have the opportunity to volunteer a whole lot. We have pretty old buildings which presents a challenge. We need to make sure kids are safe to learn. #1 Ensure Students and staff are safe and secure. #2 Prevent and respond to emergencies #3 Standardize drills. The three reasons why kids don't learn. The Board Voted in \$4.4 million dollars to help for secure and make our schools safe. In a couple of weeks 1st all certified staff , nurses, paras, custodians will go through safety training an additional 4 hours.. Areas will revolve around active shooting training, safety and procedural reviews, procedural training, on drills, and mental health/bully prevention will happen the second quarter. The 1st quarter the work is on active shooter training and safety compliance Since beginning of school every Tuesday and Thursday training is in session. Each school will have 1 drill with an officer actually present on site. There has been training for 6 schools after school for a total of two hours; 30 to 35 schools are completed; will be finished by the end of 1st quarter. Chief Ferrell and his officers are in charge. What are kids drilling on so they feel safe? 4 fire drills. Every school site has had 1 fire drill as of Sept 4th. 4 storm drills, 3 intruder/active shooter. Procedural training #1 visitors to school sites/ procedural. Make sure kids are released to correct people at all sites in the same manner. Controlled access to schools/site, Make sure all Exterior/Interior classroom Doors Lock so kids can be sheltered if need. Funnel all to one door. 2nd quarter Counselors will engage with staff. District is asking Mental Health professionals, from vendors to help beef up our mental health ie: Burrell Mental to help in this area with 11 identified schools. If it goes well will move farther. Will do two hour mental health/bullying training. All certified staff will get trained. (Paras, secretaries) to recognize when kids are being bullied, how to respond when kids say they are being bullied. Will take all these concerns seriously. Approved to hire 3 additional school police on site. All middle schools have a resource officer on site. Our own Police Force. Will have school text tip-line, can report anonymously 24/7 365 days. Gave a list of facility upgrades. In the area of safety. Addressed all cameras on exterior doors inside as well as outside. Upgraded intercoms made sure all worked properly. Making sure all schools have secure vestibule. Glendale was the only site that had a secure vestibule. We have a lot of schools to do upgrades to. Architectural are pricing right now. We have 20 plus schools getting pricing for secure vestibules. Will have total costs by 2nd meeting in Sept .We will get total cost then prioritize. Additional funds will come from future bond issue. Call 523-2911 for concerns for school police to address. District is doing everything they can with resources. Safety is everyone's responsibility. Open to questions from the floor. Voting cards on back table to register to vote. November and April

Becky Volz introduced Gerry Lee Associate Executive Director-Center for Education

Safety Gerry Lee reports from the boards perspective that School Safety is first; from state perspective Springfield is ahead of the game. School Safety is much bigger than active shooters. Statewide focus is on all of it. Safety is a culture. Change the culture. In this country Schools are the safest place for kids. Working hard to maintain. We are helping districts train in

Facilities, Policies, and Practices. Partnered with Homeland Security and Safety Center Leaders on the National level. Mission is to be Proactive. "Safety is not just a school issue".
